


HOW TO RAISE STUDENTS' EXPECTATIONS



When:

- ✓ Classwork involves solving real life problems utilizing critical thinking skills;
 - ✓ Students are involved in goal setting;
 - ✓ Students are presented with many options and choices;
 - ✓ Students are responsible for their learning, and the teachers clearly communicate their belief in each student's potential;
 - ✓ Classroom learning is experiential;
 - ✓ Students learn that there is a consequence for every behaviour;
 - ✓ Teachers assist students in achieving the goals they have set for themselves;
 - ✓ Student's performance is evaluated based on clearly defined professional standards, as opposed to, abstract, subjective grades;
 - ✓ Students have a major role in assessment which involves such things as quality, independent thinking, and ability to be a team member;
 - ✓ Teachers are role models who use the skills that the students are learning;
